

The fascination of the American public with the Civil War era – sparked in the 1990s by Ken Burns' *Civil War* and the movie *Gettysburg* – seems to be waning, which may have considerable impact upon visitation to Gettysburg and Adams County. Destination Gettysburg needs to continue the work it has started to identify and publicize the diverse

attractions of the Gettysburg/Adams County area.
